Accepting the donation for the Wounded Warrior Project was Bob Loria. Mr. Loria was a combat engineer in Iraq in February 2004 when he rushed out

with other soldiers to rescue a comrade wounded by a roadside bomb near Baqubah. After helping load the soldier onto his Humvee Loria started to drive away when a second bomb exploded. Mr. Loria lost his hand, received severe injuries to his leg and spent months recovering at the Walter Reed Army Medical Center.
