

The Association of Contracting Plumbers of the City of New York (ACP) raised more than \$30,000 at its annual golf outing on May 8, 2006 for the Sunrise Day Camp, a new one-of-a-kind day camp set to open on July 10, 2006. More than 150 members of the Association and their guests participated in the event, which was held at the Sleepy Hollow Country Club in Westchester.

The Sunrise Day Camp, which serves children ages 5-16, will be the only day camp in New York State for children with cancer. Sunrise is designed to meet the special needs of these children in a day camp setting. The camp will be offered free of charge to children being treated for cancer or related disorders.

“This year we had a special opportunity,” explained ACP President Larry Levine. “Every year the association runs a charity golf outing. When we learned of the Sunrise Day Camp – its mission-- all performed free of charge -- we knew exactly where this year’s proceeds should go. These children and their families face enormous challenges and obstacles -- we hope to make their summers a little brighter.”

Arnie Preminger, Executive Director of Sunrise Day Camp, said, “We are thankful for the support of the Association of Contracting Plumbers. By helping to raise needed funds from outside sources instead of charging the parents, we can help to alleviate some costs, and the related stress, that parents incur caring for a sick child throughout the year.”
